**5:30pm Accessing a Lightweight Directory Application Protocol Data Source Using SAS**

***Bio** – Rodney is currently working for the Sales Reporting and Analysis team, in the Global Corporate Card division of Amex. The main tasks of this group are building and maintaining a SAS data warehouse, and downstream reporting using the SAS BI Enterprise server suite of tools. Rodney has a long career using SAS dating back to the early 1980s and has worked in many different industry groups including insurance, finance, gaming, oil, retail, government to name a few.*

***Abstract** – This presentation will show the techniques of accessing a Lightweight Directory Application Protocol data source, using SAS, to create an Organisational Hierarchy. This can then be used to automatically assign user and security groups, and automatically maintain the SAS metadata (which can then be viewed through SAS Management Console).*

This presentation will walk through the implementation process and discuss challenges that were faced along the way.*
