TEAM v Scotland

Ireland make two changes to the team that lost 26-21 to France in Paris for the match with Scotland at Croke Park. Tommy Bowe is named on the right wing in place of Geordan Murphy, while lock Mick O'Driscoll comes into the team in place of Malcolm O'Kelly.

The other change to the squad sees the return of lock Paul O'Connell to the bench

15 Girvan Dempsey (Leinster)

- **02.10.75 6-2 14-5**
- **81st cap - 19T = 95pts**
- **Debut: 1998 v Georgia**
- 10th test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2001)
- Started the first 3 RWC2007 games with try v Georgia
- In fine form in 2006 and 2007, missed 2007 summer tour, but back for RWC
- 4th equal with Peter Stringer on the Ireland caps list with his 80 caps and 4th on try lists (3rd is Shane Horgan on 20T)
- 66th cap at full back (inc 7 as sub), played 9 tests on wing 1998-99 and in 2005, also 6 subs games out of position.
- Played 29 consecutive tests from summer 2003 to Australia 2005 – prior to that run, he missed tests through persistent groin injury.
- Has scored 2T from the wing, and 17T from full back in tests.
- Scored only 7T of his 19T in Six Nations games



14 **Tommy Bowe (Ulster)**

- **22.02.84** **6-3** **14-0**
- **11th cap – 3T = 15pts**
- **Debut: 2004 v USA**
- 2nd test v Scotland – no pts
- Missed 14 tests since France (31-43) in 2006 until recall v Argentina on 2007 summer tour, his last cap was in the RWC warm-up game with Scotland in August 2007
- Tries in his first two tests v USA 2004 and on tour in Japan 2005, and in first Six Nations game v Italy 2006.
- First call up for senior squad for 2004 autumn tests, had only played a dozen times for Ulster. Now has 31T in 84 Ulster games
- Impressed with Ireland U21 (team reached World final, but he was injured en route) and with Ulster in Celtic League.
- Can also play at fullback.

13 **Brian O'Driscoll (Leinster)(captain)**

- **21.01.79** **5-11** **14-13**
- **82nd cap - 31T 4DG = 167pts**
- **Debut: 1999 v Australia**
- 9th test v Scotland – 4T = 20pts (1T in 2000, 3T in 2002)
- 44 tests as captain, which beats Keith Wood's previous record of 36, and has led Ireland to 31 wins in 44 tests
- Ireland record 31T in internationals, 2T more than Denis Hickie
- 81 caps takes him 2nd equal on the Ireland caps list with John Hayes
- Has 17T in Six Nations, beating the Irish record of 14T by George Stephenson, with his try v Wales 2007 and is 5th in the all-time list – three players have 18T in equal 2nd place (Lowe, G Edwards, R Underwood)
- Scored test hat tricks v France (2000) and Scotland (2002)
- 4 games at RWC2007 with tries in first game v Namibia and in last match v Argentina
- All 3 Lions tests in Australia 2001. Lions captain in 2005, first from Ireland since Ciaran Fitzgerald in 1983
- 2006 Six Nations Player of Tournament

12 **Andrew Trimble (Ulster)**

- **20.10.84** **6-2** **15-6**
- **22nd cap - 8T = 40pts**
- **Debut: 2005 v Australia**
- 3rd test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2007)
- 2 games at RWC2007, with try in opener v Namibia
- 5th cap in centre, 9 caps on left wing, 3 caps on right wing and 5 sub tests. Missed last two 2006 autumn series tests through injury and replaced by returning Denis Hickie. Now has further chances following Hickie's retirement after RWC2007 and a broken arm suffered by Gordon D'Arcy v Italy 2008.
- First call up for 2005 autumn series tests
- 4th season with Ulster Rugby and has 21T in 52 games for Ulster
- Former Ireland Schools and Ireland U21 centre, plays club rugby for Ballymena

11 **Robert Kearney (Leinster)**

- **26.03.86** **6-1** **14-13**
- **4th cap – no pts**
- **Debut: 2007 v Argentina**
- 1st test v Scotland
- On for Gordon D'Arcy (broken arm) v Italy 2008 after 31 mins and retains place
- Played for Ireland at Schools, U19 captain, and A levels, then won full cap on 2007 summer tour.
- Debut for Leinster in September 2005, has played 57 games since then with 13T
- Student at UCD



10 Ronan O’Gara (Munster)

- **07.03.77** **6-0** **13-1**
- **80th cap - 14T 124C 150PG 11DG = 801pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Scotland**
- 9th test v Scotland – 1T (2000& 12C 18PG = 83pts)
- First points and try scorer for Ireland at Croke Park (v France 2007) and also RBS Man of Match for all 17pts in 17-20 defeat
- Has 417 Six Nations points to date – second behind Jonny Wilkinson (456) and ahead of Neil Jenkins (406)
- Now 8th on world points lists – Percy Montgomery is 7th with 873pts
- Top of the points list for 2005 and 2006 and 2007 Six Nations
- One of the players who made their test debuts v Scotland in 2000 immediately after the 50-18 loss at Twickenham
- 2005 Lions v NZ – 3rd test (sub)
- Played in three Heineken Cup finals with Munster, with 13pts in the 23-19 win against Biarritz in 2006. Also Lions tourist 2001 to Australia

9 Eoin Reddan (London Wasps, England)

- **20.11.80** **5-7** **12-8**
- **8th cap – no pts**
- **Debut: 2006 v France**
- 2nd test v Scotland – no pts
- RBS Man of Match v Italy 2008 in first Six Nations start
- Has signed new 3yr deal with Wasps in February 2008
- Started the last 2 group games at RWC2007 – winning place over Stringer and Boss – and first choice at start of 2008 Six Nations
- Made test debut v France in 31-43 loss in 2006 with Ireland at one stage 3-43 down.
- 4th season with Wasps, initially vied with Matt Dawson for scrum half role, won 2006 Powergen Cup and 2007 Heineken Cup winners medals
- Missed 2006 summer tour to rectify groin problem, late starter in 2006-07 season, missed 2006 autumn tests, but back for 2007 in national squad
- Originally with Connacht and Munster (understudy at Munster to Stringer)

8 Jamie Heaslip (Leinster)

- **15.12.83** **6-3** **16-7**
- **6th cap – no pts**
- **Debut: 2006 v Pacific Islanders**
- 2nd test v Scotland – no pts
- Had been cover in the squad before being brought in to the 2006 autumn series squad to win first cap.
- Scorer of the final try at Lansdowne Road (Leinster v Ulster 31.12.06)
- Was a nominee for the IRB Young Player of the Year in 2004
- Has played around 60 games for Leinster since making debut in March 2005 in Celtic League
- Has come through the Ireland development system with caps at U19, U21 and has played in 2005 and 2006 for Ireland A
- Dublin University student

7 David Wallace (Munster)

- **08.07.76** 6-2 16-3
- **44th cap - 8T = 40pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Argentina**
- 8th test v Scotland – 2T = 10pts (1T in 2003, 2004)
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter
- Returned v Italy in opening Six Nations test of 2006, he had previously played only once in 13 internationals (Japan in summer 2005) since 2004 summer tour. Had been injured.
- Played 10 of 11 tests in 2006 (rested v Pacific Islanders), he was recalled in 2006 after fine form in Heineken Cup win. And all games in 2007 Six Nations – then rested for summer tour
- 3 major long term absences from Ireland line-up due to injury
- Lion in 2001, all 3 Wallace brothers are British Lions.
- Ireland Development tour in 1997, then U21 and A caps, then senior tour to SA in 1999 and 1st cap on 2000 senior tour in Argentina.

6 Denis Leamy (Munster)

- **27.11.81** 6-2 17-0
- **30th cap - 1T = 5pts**
- **Debut: 2004 v USA**
- 3rd test v Scotland – no pts
- Third start at No 6, after Japan on 2005 summer tour, and France 2008
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter
- First test try in 2006 Triple Crown win v England
- Played all 11 tests of 2006, and 20 consecutive tests before being rested for summer 2007 to Argentina
- 24 tests at No 8 (inc sub), after replacing his Munster captain Anthony Foley, he started in all back row positions in first four caps.
- First senior call up for 2004 autumn tests. Missed 5 tests through injury in spring 2005.
- Played around 100 games for Munster in all competitions (inc Magners League and Heineken Cup). 2006 Heineken Cup winners medal at No 6
- Capped at Schools and U21 levels.

5 Mick O'Driscoll (Munster)

- **08.10.78** 6-5 17-0
- **14th cap (if he plays) – no pts**
- **Debut: 2001 v Romania**
- 1st test v Scotland – no pts
- Not at RWC2007, previously capped on 2007 summer tour to Argentina in both tests
- First test start, v Italy 2007, nearly 6yrs after test debut, and after first 8 tests as sub
- Third test start v Scotland 2008
- Ireland A captain, and former U21 international back in 1998
- Played for Munster since 1998 but spent 2003-05 with Perpignan before returning to Munster. 2006 Heineken Cup win.
- Same club side as O'Callaghan, Leamy and O'Gara at Cork Constitution



4 **Donncha O'Callaghan (Munster)**

- **24.03.79** **6-6** **17-5**
- **43rd cap - 1T = 5pts**
- **Debut: 2003 v Wales**
- 5th test v Scotland – no pts
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter
- Scored his first test try v France 2006 in the fine recovery from 3-43 to 31-43
- Had appeared in all Ireland's 18 tests since the start of 2005 autumn series – until rested for summer 2007 tour
- Played 2nd and 3rd tests for Lions v NZ
- Some 100 games for Munster despite internationals Galwey, O'Driscoll and O'Connell also featuring in his position. Progressed via Ireland U19 (1998 world champions), U21 and A side.
- 2006 Heineken Cup win
- Came into Ireland training squad for 2003 Six Nations after Gary Longwell tore hamstring v France. Test debut v Wales in 25-24 success at Cardiff.

3 **John Hayes (Munster)**

- **02.11.73** **6-4** **19-10**
- **82nd cap - 2T = 10pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Scotland**
- 10th test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2005)
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter
- Played the first 15 tests of 2006 and 2007 before being rested for the 2007 summer tour to Argentina
- 2nd equal on Ireland's all time caps list on 81 caps with O'Driscoll
- Test tries v Romania in Sept 2002 and Scotland 2005.
- Passed Phil Orr (58 caps) as Ireland's most capped prop
- 2005 Lions v Pumas, did not make test side in NZ
- His first 34 caps came in 35 tests (rested v USA in summer 2000) until injured before the 2003 summer tour. Missed 6 tests before RWC2003 after groin injury. Then had a run of 20 successive tests to 2005 Lions tour.
- First game of rugby aged 18, with Bruff RFC in Limerick, then moved to Shannon aged 20 and went on to win 1995 club title. Then went to NZ 1995-1997 (Invercargill), back to help Shannon win 1998 title. Now back with Bruff
- Heineken Cup final losses in 2000 and 2002 and then the win of 2006
- One of the players who made their test debuts v Scotland in 2000 immediately after the 50-18 loss at Twickenham

2 **Bernard Jackman (Leinster)**

- **05.05.76** **6-1** **17-13**
- **7th cap – no pts**
- **Debut: 2005 v Japan**
- 1st test v Scotland
- First made the Ireland squad for the 1998 tour to SA, but not capped until Japan tour in 2005, and then again on the 2007 summer tour to Argentina and made Six Nations debut as sub v Italy in 2008
- Hooker from the leading club side Clontarf, and the improving Connacht province in 73 games, who returned to Leinster in 2005 and has made a marked improvement.
- 47 games for Leinster to date
- Formerly also with Lansdowne, he has also played for Sale Sharks in the Zurich Premiership in 24 games.
- From the Ireland A squad, which he has captained.



1 **Marcus Horan (Munster)**

- **07.09.77** 6-1 16-8
- **54th cap - 5T = 25pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v USA**
- 6th test v Scotland – no pts
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter, 7 of the 8 forwards started all 4 games (Hooker changed)
- Played in 28 of the previous 31 Ireland tests before injury before Scotland 2007 match since suffering back injury in 2004 – had previously played 16 times in 18 tests before that injury.
- Played all 5 games at RWC2003.
- Has come through to replace Peter Clohessy and Reggie Corrigan, and was originally used as impact player
- Won 2 All Ireland club titles with Shannon, and 2006 Heineken Cup with Munster
- Munster schools in 1996, senior provincial debut in 1998 and capped as sub v USA on 2000 summer tour. Played 13 times for Ireland A before promotion in 2002.

Substitutes

16 **Rory Best (Ulster)**

- **15.09.82** 5-11 16-10
- **20th cap (if he plays) - 2T = 10pts**
- **Debut: 2005 v NZ**
- 3rd test v Scotland – no pts
- Played in 3 of the 4 RWC2007 games – started the first two games v Namibia and Georgia (try), then sub v Argentina. The other 7 forwards started all 4 games
- Started all 2007 Six Nations tests
- First test try v Pacific Islanders 2006, then 2nd try after 45 secs v Wales 2007 in his next game.
- Started v SA and Australia 2006 for injured Jerry Flannery (shoulder), who played nine games in a row in 2005-06 season, and then retained place for all of the 2007 Six Nations
- Impressed in Heineken Cup to first claim place in squad
- 5th season with Ulster, is the brother of Simon Best, and the brothers play for same club as the capped Neil Best
- Educated at Portadown College, and was with Ireland at 2003 World U21 Cup.

17 **Tony Buckley (Munster)**

- **08.10.80** 6-5 21-1
- **5th cap (if he plays) – no pts**
- **Debut: 2007 v Argentina**
- 1st test v Scotland
- Late call up to RWC when Simon Best became ill
- Former lock forward in his younger days
- Munster debut in 2005, won national club title with Shannon, and into national squad in 2007
- Only 25 games for Munster to date since September 2005
- First capped on 2007 summer tour to Argentina, then Six Nations debut as sub v Italy 2008

18 Paul O'Connell (Munster)

- **20.10.79** 6-6 17-7
- **50th cap (if he plays) 6T = 30pts**
- **Debut: 2002 v Wales**
- 6th test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2005)
- Returns after playing all 4 games at RWC2007 but picking up a back injury
- Scorer of the last test try at Lansdowne Road (v Pacific Islanders 2006) and captain in the first game at Croke Park
- RBS Man of Match in England's record Home Internationals defeat at Croke Park in 2007
- Ireland captain v France 2004, Scotland 2005, France 2007 (O'Driscoll had hamstring tear each time) and Italy on 24.08.07
- Won 25 caps in 27 tests to end of 2005 Six Nations, then went on Lions tour, starting all 3 tests. Then won 14 caps in 15 tests from the start of 2006 until missing the final 2007 Six Nations game v Italy
- Breakthrough at RWC2003 – impressed in all 5 games (no pts)
- Munster debut in 1999, and started in 2006 Heineken Cup final win. Has come through via Development XV and Ireland A. From Limerick. Talented golfer (off 4) and swimmer who decided to concentrate on rugby.

19 Simon Easterby (Scarlets, Wales)

- **27.01.75** 6-3 16-10
- **64th cap (if he plays) - 8T = 40pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Scotland**
- 8th test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2002)
- Overtaken Anthony Foley (62 caps) as Ireland's most capped back-row forward
- All 4 RWC2007 games as starter – try in opener v Namibia
- Played all 2006 and 2007 Six Nations but then rested for both summer tours
- Captain in two 2005 autumn tests v NZ and Australia, took over captaincy from injured Brian O'Driscoll.
- Won 20 caps in a row before missing Japan summer tour 2005, as he went on Lions tour, played impressively in last 2 tests v NZ, scored try in 2nd Lions test, then returned to captain country.
- Played for hometown Harrogate, then Leeds Tykes and was eligible for England, but then had a spell with Sydney University before joining Llanelli in 1999.
- Originally played for the Irish Exiles in early part of career and is younger brother of Guy Easterby (28 caps 2000-05).
- Plays his club rugby in Wales – Powergen Cup final 2006 v Wasps
- One of the players in who made their test debuts v Scotland in 2000 immediately after the 50-18 loss at Twickenham

20 Peter Stringer (Munster)

- **13.12.77** 5-7 11-5
- **81st cap (if he plays) - 6T = 30pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Scotland**
- 10th test v Scotland – 1T = 5pts (in 2004)
- Played first two games of RWC2007 v Namibia and Georgia
- First 80 caps in 90 Ireland tests and is 4th equal behind O'Kelly (91) in the Ireland caps lists along with Dempsey
- 54 test starts with O'Gara after RWC2007; world record is Gregan and Larkham with 76 tests.
- One of the players who made their test debuts v Scotland in 2000 immediately after the 50-18 loss at Twickenham
- Three Heineken Cup finals with Munster- losses in 2000 and 2002 and a try in the 2006 win against Biarritz.
- Probably the smallest in Six Nations at 5-7 and 11-0



21 **Paddy Wallace (Ulster)**

- **27.08.79** 5-11 12-11
- **7th cap (if he plays) - 1T 10C 6PG = 43pts**
- **Debut: 2006 v SA**
- 2nd test v Scotland – 1C 3PG = 11pts (in 2007)
- One game at RWC 2007 – sub in opener v Namibia
- Sub v SA in added time in November 2006, then 26pts v Pacific Islanders on full debut. Was the first Ireland No 10 who was not Humphreys or O’Gara for 78 tests and 7 years (Elwood v Romania at RWC99)
- And the first who was not Elwood, Humphreys or O’Gara in Ireland’s No 10 jersey for 10 years and 115 games (Paul Burke v Italy 1997)
- Has been with Ulster since 2001, and though a fly-half he found David Humphreys (72 caps) as first choice, so he became the utility player in the squad.
- Has played for Ireland at U19 (World Cup winners) U21, A and Sevens, and has been in the full national squad since 2002.
- 7th season in Ulster squad, and has played 99 games for Ulster

22 **Shane Horgan (Leinster)**

- **18.07.78** 6-4 16-5
- **59th cap (if he plays) – 20T = 100pts**
- **Debut: 2000 v Scotland**
- 9th test v Scotland – 2T = 10pts (1T in 2000, 2002)
- Recently bothered with a rib injury, made comeback for Ireland A v England Saxons on 01.02.08, and was on bench v France
- Played final three group games at RWC2007
- Played 11 tests in centre, 47 caps on wing
- Now has only O’Driscoll (31) and Hickie (29) ahead in the Ireland try lists
- Has been in the Leinster squad since 1998
- Sub for 2005 Lions v Pumas and v NZ (all 3 tests)
- One of 5 current players who made their test debuts v Scotland in 2000 immediately after the 50-18 loss at Twickenham (Horgan, O’Gara, Stringer, Hayes, S Easterby)

Coach

Eddie O’Sullivan

- Appointed in November 2001, after being assistant under Warren Gatland, won 3 Triple Crowns in 2004, 2006 and 2007, and was assistant coach of the 2005 Lions
- Former coach of Connacht, Blackrock College, Ireland U21 and US Eagles
- Played for Garryowen, and former PE teacher
- In August 2007, his contract was extended to 2012.
