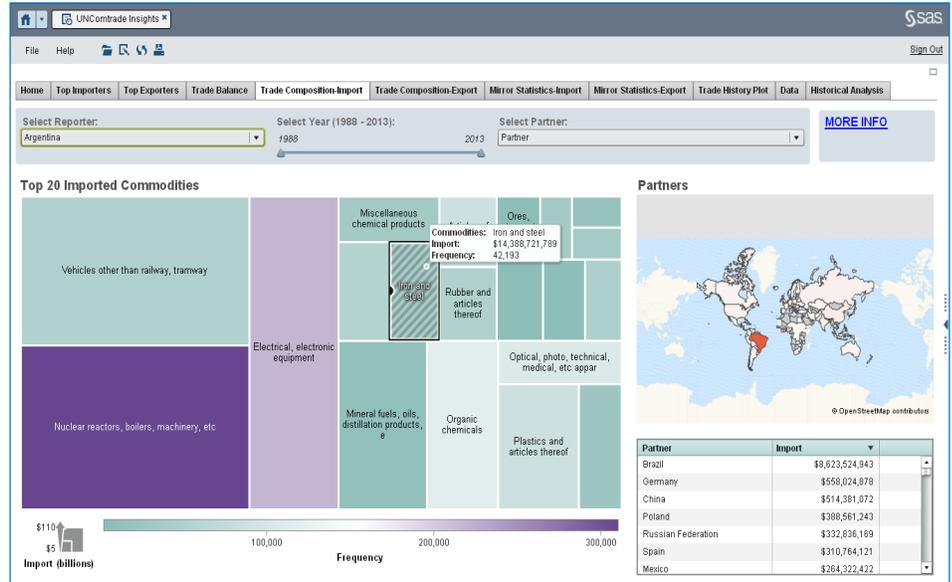


Figure 1: Trade composition: Most frequently traded commodities by partners.

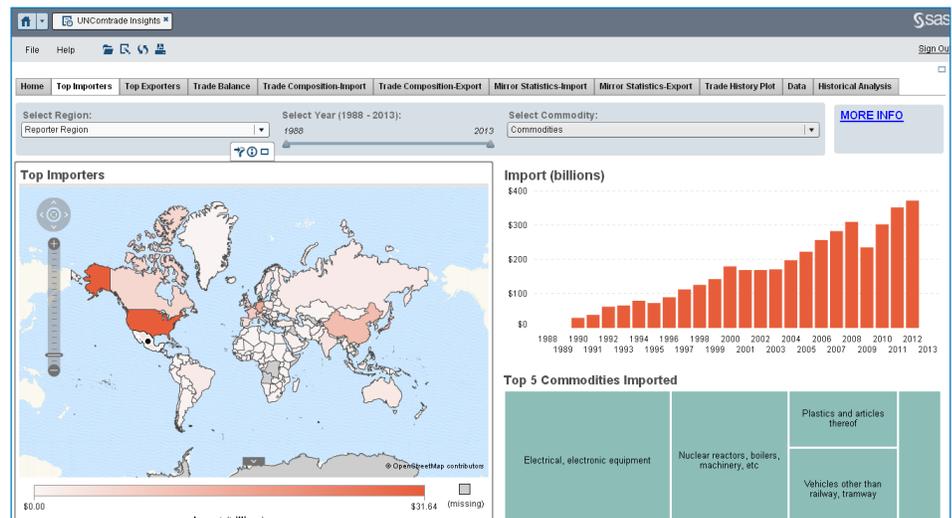


Figure 2: Imports/exports: Top importers and exporters by world, region and country, and what commodities they trade.
